



Carol Beth Woolworth

October 24, 1939 - August 5, 2026

Atlanta, Georgia

Atlanta lost Carol Beth Woolworth on August 5, 2026. She was 86. Born October 24, 1939 in Atlanta, carrying Bulgarian-American stories that arrived without footnotes. She learned early that a day is something you finish, not something you wait for.

She issued tools that kept crews from improvising danger. A tool-room checkout stamp was gospel in small print. Colleagues still mention a tool-room checkout stamp.

In 1965 she married Arthur. The marriage was not a speech; it was groceries, repairs, and a daughter and two sons walked to school in weather that did not care. When Arthur died in 2019, she kept what still worked: the early walk, the small garden, the call on Sundays.

Neighbors remember a jumper cable offered before the tow truck was dialed. Mornings were her favorite shift at home. She died in Atlanta, on streets that already knew her pace. The calendar still has a circle on payday.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. Her life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
