



Clyde Joseph Sorrentino

September 4, 1950 - September 11, 2026

Columbus, Georgia

On September 11, 2026, Clyde Joseph Sorrentino died at home in Columbus. He was 76. Born on September 4, 1950 and raised among Sicilian-American manners that never needed a speech. Young, he understood that quiet competence outlasts loud plans.

She took blood pressures and worries with the same steady hands. A cuff pouch stitched by hand held more than equipment. Colleagues still mention a blood-pressure cuff pouch.

In 1976 he married Sharon. The marriage was not a speech; it was groceries, repairs, and two daughters walked to school in weather that did not care. When Sharon died in 2019, he kept what still worked: the early walk, the small garden, the call on Sundays.

Neighbors remember covered dishes that arrived without a speech. Mornings were his favorite shift at home. He died in Columbus, on streets that already knew his pace. The tools are still hung where a hand can find them in the dark.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. His life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
