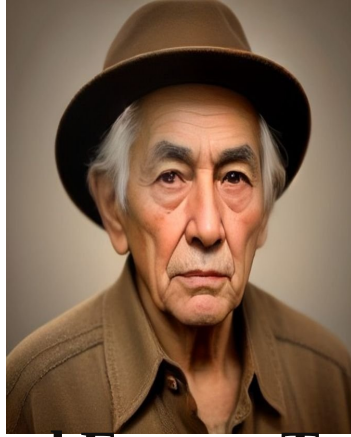




Floyd Eugene Torres

October 19, 1944 - August 12, 2026

Charlotte, North Carolina

Floyd Eugene Torres died in Charlotte on August 12, 2026. He was 81. Born on October 19, 1944, with Mexican-American roots that shaped the table more than the flag. He learned early that a day is something you finish, not something you wait for.

He fixed frames that fed a city. A toolbox with drawers labeled twice was his map; downtime offended him like a personal slight. Colleagues still mention a toolbox with drawers labeled twice.

He married Janice in 1966. They kept a house that stayed modest when the neighborhood did not. They raised a son through public schools and ordinary weather. After Janice died in 2019, he kept the routines that still made sense: the walk, the garden, the Sunday call.

Neighbors remember coffee offered before questions. He liked early mornings before the heat or the noise. He died in Charlotte, among streets he never needed to explain. The extra coffee is still in the thermos.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. His life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
