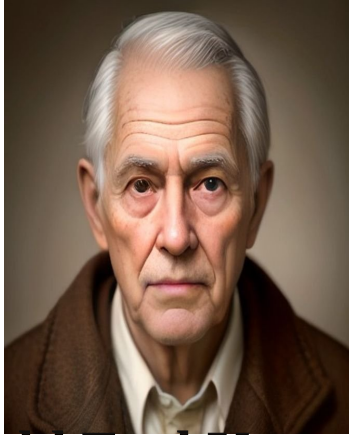




Gerald Earl Kuznetsov

May 16, 1947 - August 18, 2026

Evansville, Indiana

Evansville lost Gerald Earl Kuznetsov on August 18, 2026. He was 79. Born on May 16, 1947, with Ukrainian-American roots that shaped the table more than the flag. From the start, he treated promises like tools: keep them sharp, do not lend them lightly.

He cut meat and credit with equal care. A butcher's steel hung by the door; regulars came for both. Colleagues still mention a butcher's steel hung by the door.

He and Susan married in 1971 and raised four children without needing an audience. After Susan's death in 2019, he held to quiet habits-coffee before dawn, a tended yard, a voice on the phone that still checked in.

Neighbors remember a shovel borrowed and returned sharper. Mornings were his favorite shift at home. He died in Evansville, on streets that already knew his pace. The chair by the window still holds the shape of a habit.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. His life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
