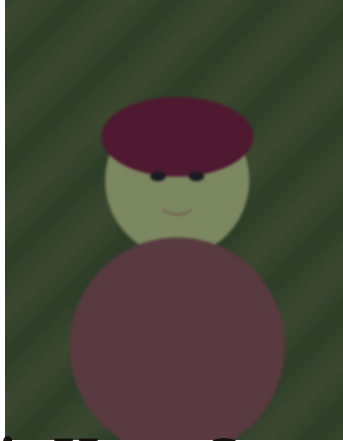




Lois Hope Quezada

April 10, 1935 - September 4, 2026

Rapid City, South Dakota

In Rapid City, on September 4, 2026, Lois Hope Quezada died at 91. Born in Rapid City on April 10, 1935, into a Hmong-American household that treated work as a language. She learned that neighborhoods remember who helps without being asked.

She turned barns into readiness for strangers who would not stay. A barn broom tagged for nights taught that small mercies matter. Colleagues still mention a barn broom tagged for nights.

In 1958 she married Joseph. The marriage was not a speech; it was groceries, repairs, and three daughters walked to school in weather that did not care. When Joseph died in 2019, she kept what still worked: the early walk, the small garden, the call on Sundays.

Neighbors remember a porch light left on for anyone walking home late. Mornings were her favorite shift at home. She died in Rapid City, on streets that already knew her pace. The chair by the window still holds the shape of a habit.

Services

Services in Rapid City will be simple: stories, coffee, and the names of people who showed up. Flowers optional; support for a local clinic or trade scholarship preferred.
