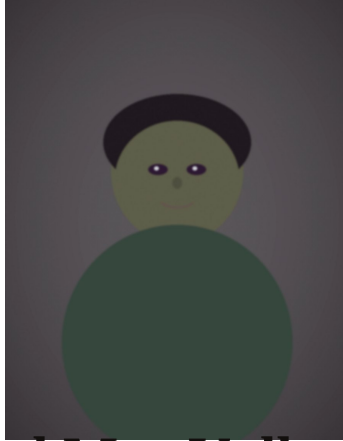




Mildred Mae Vollenweider

April 6, 1931 - August 7, 2026

Anchorage, Alaska

Anchorage lost Mildred Mae Vollenweider on August 7, 2026. She was 95. Born on April 6, 1931 and raised among German-American manners that never needed a speech. She grew up believing that showing up was the first craft.

She kept auction sheets that turned cattle into wages without inventing bids. An auction paddle with a chipped corner ended arguments more gently than speeches. Colleagues still mention an auction paddle with a chipped corner.

In 1957 she married William. The marriage was not a speech; it was groceries, repairs, and three daughters walked to school in weather that did not care. When William died in 2019, she kept what still worked: the early walk, the small garden, the call on Sundays.

Neighbors remember a jumper cable offered before the tow truck was dialed. Mornings were her favorite shift at home. She died in Anchorage, on streets that already knew her pace. The calendar still has a circle on payday.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. Her life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
