March 4, 1958 - August 11, 2026

Tucson, Arizona

Patricia Elaine Moreno died in Tucson on August 11, 2026. She was sixty-eight. Born there on March 4, 1958, she grew up knowing the desert as a neighbor, not a backdrop. She learned the names of streets by the heat they held after five o'clock. She became a clerk for the United States Postal Service because the work was steady, the benefits were real, and she liked a job with a beginning and an end to the day.

For twenty-nine years she stood behind a counter and made other people's errands less of a fight. She knew who needed the passport form explained twice and who only needed the window to open on time. She did not raise her voice at December. She treated a long line as weather. When the building got a machine that was supposed to replace a person, she learned the machine and then taught it manners. She retired with a pin and a party she tried to leave early.

She married David Moreno in 1983. They bought a block house with a gravel yard she slowly turned into shade. A son and a daughter grew up under palo verde and a rule that you wrote thank-you notes. David taught shop. Patricia kept the stamps in a tin and the family calendar on the refrigerator as if those two objects ran the republic. After work she walked the neighborhood loop with a friend who talked and a dog that did not, which she said was the correct ratio.

Friends remember a woman who remembered your hold request, who brought tamales at Christmas without announcing a tradition, and who could sit through a monsoon warning without making it a personality. She loved a library sale, a good green-corn tamale, and the late light on the Catalinas. She died in Tucson, in the heat she had always said you could live with if you respected it. The counter is someone else's now. The patience she practiced there is harder to replace than a clerk.
