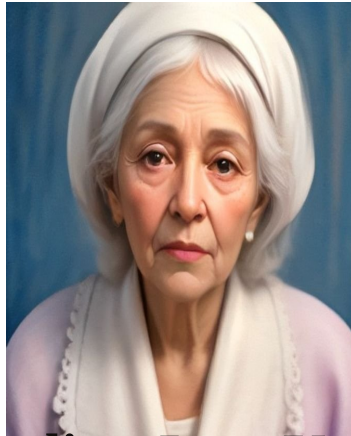




Pauline Jean Keita

Green Bay lost Pauline Jean Keita on August 25, 2026. She was 74. Born on March 13, 1952, with Malian-American roots that shaped the table more than the flag. Early on, she decided that a paycheck and a handshake should weigh the same.

She made change for badges and school groups with equal courtesy. A tip jar labeled for the crew meant the day belonged to everyone. Colleagues still mention a tip jar labeled for the crew.

She and Michael married in 1976 and raised three children without needing an audience. After Michael's death in 2019, she held to quiet habits-coffee before dawn, a tended yard, a voice on the phone that still checked in.

Neighbors remember quiet help with a stuck mailbox or a heavy trash can. She preferred the hour before a town fully wakes. Green Bay was home enough that she never rehearsed an introduction. The work gloves still keep the shape of a grip.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. Her life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
