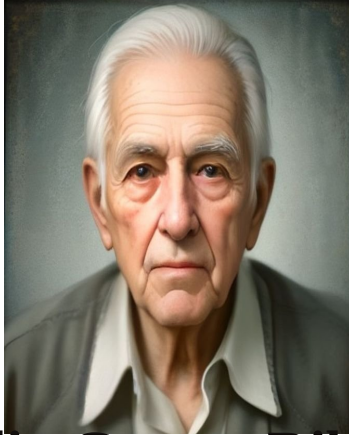




Philip George Ribeiro

May 25, 1938 - August 22, 2026

Billings, Montana

Billings lost Philip George Ribeiro on August 22, 2026. He was 88. Born on May 25, 1938, with Portuguese-American roots that shaped the table more than the flag. He grew up believing that showing up was the first craft.

He ran nights when the plant felt like another country. A night-shift whistle kept tempo without cruelty. Colleagues still mention a night-shift whistle.

He and Nancy married in 1962 and raised a daughter and two sons without needing an audience. After Nancy's death in 2019, he held to quiet habits-coffee before dawn, a tended yard, a voice on the phone that still checked in.

Neighbors remember coffee offered before questions. He preferred the hour before a town fully wakes. Billings was home enough that he never rehearsed an introduction. The garden will come up next spring without being told.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. His life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
