



Rose Marie Two Bulls

June 12, 1960 - September 5, 2026

Rapid City, South Dakota

Rose Marie Two Bulls died in Rapid City on September 5, 2026. She was sixty-six. Born there on June 12, 1960, she grew up between a clinic waiting room and a kitchen table where Lakota was spoken when the conversation needed to be exact. She learned a schedule before she learned a lecture. A correct appointment, she said, is a kind of respect.

She spent twenty-four years as a scheduler at an Indian Health Service clinic, first on a night desk that smelled of burnt coffee, later as the calm voice that found a ride when the weather turned. She did not shout into a telephone. She repeated a time until the person on the other end had it, then she wrote it in a book she treated as a kind of prayer. Families trusted her because she would tell them when she did not know, which is rarer than bravery.

She married Daniel Two Bulls in 1984. They raised a daughter and a son in a house with a view of the hills and a freezer that friends had shared. Daniel taught shop. Rose packed lunches that could survive a fourteen-hour shift and still taste like home. She walked the creek path before dawn because that was when the water looked like work instead of recreation.

Neighbors remember a woman who brought soup to a night shift without staying for thanks, who knew which intern needed a second explanation, and who could hear a weather radio without making it a personality. She loved a late-summer chokecherry, a clean map, and the particular silence after a clinic empties. She died in Rapid City, the high city that had always been enough map. The desk is still open. Someone else will say the times. They will say them a little faster than she did.
