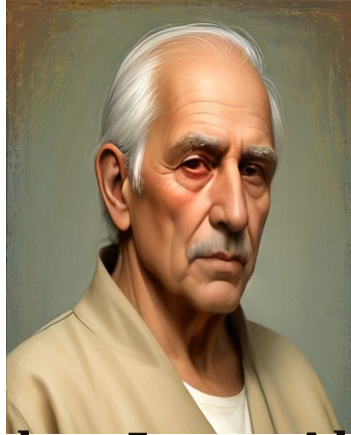




Walter James Alami

January 1, 1945 - September 1, 2026

Birmingham, Alabama

Birmingham lost Walter James Alami on September 1, 2026. He was 81. He was born on January 1, 1945 in a Lebanese-American family that measured love in finished chores. He learned early that a day is something you finish, not something you wait for.

He timed gates and water like a metronome nobody else could hear. A brass padlock key tagged in grease pencil stayed in his pocket through every shift. Colleagues still mention a brass padlock key tagged in grease pencil.

He and Helen married in 1969 and raised two daughters without needing an audience. After Helen's death in 2019, he held to quiet habits-coffee before dawn, a tended yard, a voice on the phone that still checked in.

Neighbors remember covered dishes that arrived without a speech. He liked early mornings before the heat or the noise. He died in Birmingham, among streets he never needed to explain. The extra coffee is still in the thermos.

What remains is not a legend but a practice: showing up, keeping a promise, leaving a place better than you found it. His life was the kind America is built from and too often forgets to name.
