The Lancaster County Clerk published that the Board of Commissioners and the Engineering Department will hold a public hearing Tuesday, October 6, 2026, at 6:30 p.m., in Room 112 of the County-City Building in Lincoln, on the proposed One and Six-Year Road and Bridge Improvement Program for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2027, through June 30, 2032, as proposed by the County Engineer pursuant to law. School districts, fire districts, cities, villages, farmers unions and co-ops with an interest in road and bridge work are named on the same sheet.

Jefferson County, Washington, already has an October 5 six-year TIP paper. This is a different county and a different statute. Do not stack them.

What a one- and six-year program is

Nebraska counties post a one-year construction list and a six-year outlook. The hearing is the hour the public may speak to that list before the Board acts. It is not the letting. It is not the audit. Your Tax Dollar at the County Door already split those files. Keep them split.

Closing

Tuesday, October 6, 2026, 6:30 p.m., Room 112, County-City Building, Lincoln. That is when Lancaster County posted that it will hear the roads. Come for the list. Do not ask this paper to pave it.

A published county hearing on the roads list is a public hour in a named room. It is not a bid. Date Room 112. Leave the capitol on the skyline.
