Saturday, September 26, 2026, Boston Harbor and the New England coast:
the September nor’easter is the public clock.

One date. One coast. One set of NWS products. A nor’easter already on the water is a public clock. It is not a newspaper weather column, a pageant, or Legal Publication at checkout.

A public paper from Notice Nearby. Record of Sale, LLC (Oregon). September 26, 2026 — written the same day as the clock. Effective immediately.

What is in force on this clock

A slow-moving September nor'easter is already working the Atlantic seaboard from the Chesapeake through Maine. National Weather Service Boston/Norton products remain live for eastern and southern New England: a High Wind Warning on the Massachusetts and Rhode Island coast through 8:00 a.m. Sunday; a Coastal Flood Warning on east-facing Massachusetts — including Suffolk, Eastern Essex, Eastern Norfolk, Eastern Plymouth, Barnstable, Dukes, and Nantucket — through 8:00 p.m. Sunday; a Flood Watch for eastern and parts of central Massachusetts through 2:00 a.m. Tuesday.

Boston Harbor high tides this Saturday are about 11:34 a.m. and 11:54 p.m. NWS has flagged about one foot of inundation above ground in low-lying shoreline and tidal waterways on those tides. East-facing South Shore and Cape towns carry the higher coastal-flood concern across repeated high-tide cycles. A full moon is lifting the astronomical tides. That is a tide-table fact, not a verdict.

Coastal gusts already in the morning record: Boston Logan 45 mph; Plymouth 49; New Bedford 48; Chatham 55; Hyannis 59; Martha's Vineyard 60; Nantucket 64; isolated Cape reports near 70. Inland New England is seeing 30–45 mph. Storm-total rain of 2–4 inches is the working number for southern New England, with local 5–7 inches possible. Leaves are still on the trees. Saturated ground plus long-duration northeast wind is the outage and limb risk.

The days, not the pageant

Saturday. Rain and strong northeast wind Virginia to Maine. Heaviest rain southern New Jersey through northern Massachusetts. Evening high-tide coastal flooding again.

Sunday. The low meanders near the Jersey Shore. Rain and gusts linger over southern New England, including Boston.

Monday–Tuesday. The system lifts along the New England coast and weakens. Showers and a flood watch can hold into early Tuesday.

County doors

Suffolk County is the Boston door — FIPS 25025. The harbor tides named above sit in that county. Essex holds the North Shore and Gloucester. Norfolk and Plymouth hold the South Shore, including Scituate. Barnstable, Dukes, and Nantucket hold the Cape and Islands, where the highest gusts are already on the sheet. Bristol and the Rhode Island coastal counties sit under High Wind Warning and coastal-flood products. Connecticut counties remain under a Wind Advisory through Sunday noon. Maine and New Hampshire keep coastal flood advisories on the Downeast and Seacoast doors.

Mid-Atlantic counties from Delaware and New Jersey through New York remain under the same storm, including state-of-emergency declarations in parts of New York and New Jersey. Those are their county records. This paper does not adopt them as its organ. The door printed here is New England, with Boston Harbor as the named clock.

A reading of wind on a buoy is not a statute. A mayor's travel advice is not this register. Closures, evacuations, and utility orders belong to the county, the city, MassDOT, MBTA, Logan, and the utilities. Read those instruments where they are posted.

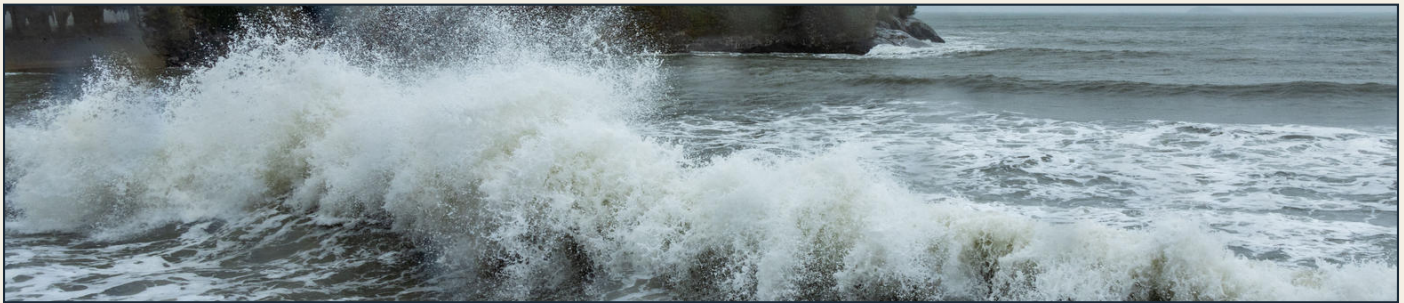


Plate 4. High surf against a Massachusetts shoreline. Surf is weather. It is not Legal Publication.

What this paper will not do

It will not close a road. It will not cancel a flight. It will not enroll a reader in Legal Publication. It will not treat a seawall photograph as a statute. It will not sell placement of a storm. It will not move a New Jersey emergency into a Suffolk County heading. It will not turn a flood watch into a finding.

Closing

Saturday, September 26, 2026, Boston Harbor and the New England coast. That is the hour already in force. Stay off the seawall if the county told you to. Do not ask this paper to become the Weather Service.

A posted NWS product is a public hour on a named coast. It is not a newspaper. Date the harbor. Leave the evacuation to the county that issues it.
