A public paper from Notice Nearby. Record of Sale, LLC (Oregon). September 26, 2026 — written the same day as the clock.

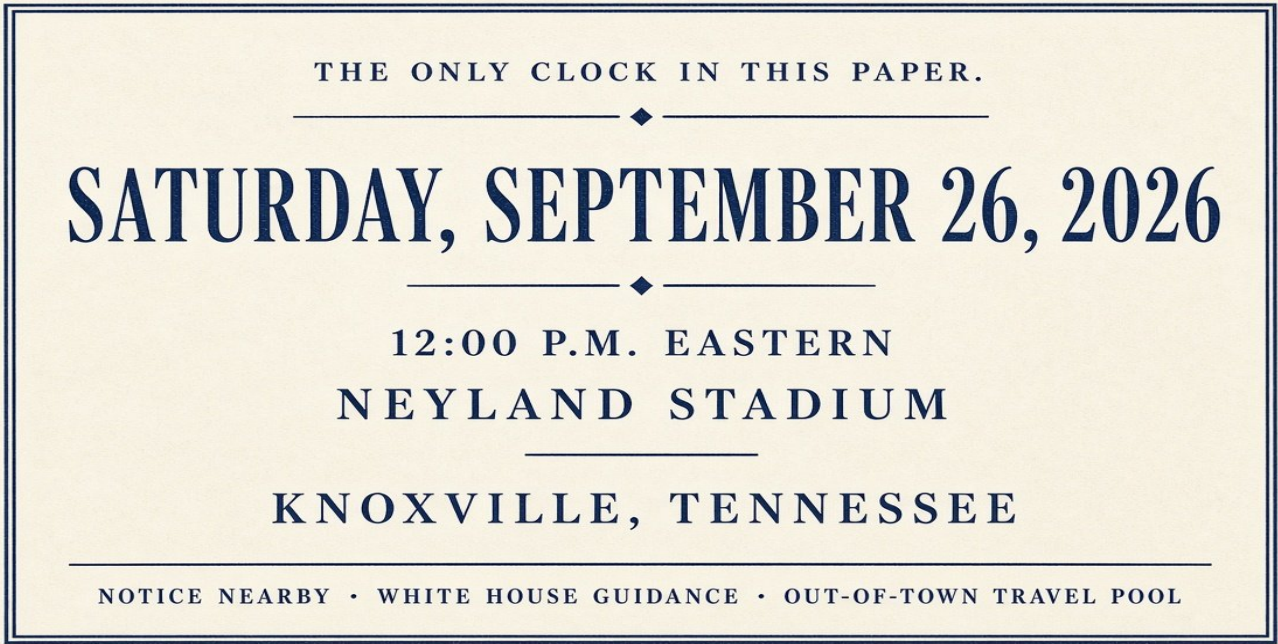


Plate 1. The only clock in this paper. Saturday, September 26, 2026, 12:00 p.m. Eastern, Neyland Stadium, Knoxville.

Why this paper replaces Thursday

The East Room remarks were Thursday. This clock is Saturday. The White House Office of Communications issued daily guidance for September 26, 2026: 12:00 p.m., the President attends the University of Tennessee vs. University of Texas college football game, Neyland Stadium, out-of-town travel pool. Departure from the house was listed open press. Arrival back at the house was listed open press. Those are travel lines. The appointment in the bowl is noon.

The only clock

Kickoff is listed at noon Eastern on ABC. Knoxville Police told local readers to expect extra security and extra time. Stadium capacity is published at 101,915. A pool report after noon recorded the President on the jumbotron. That is how a White House movement looks when it leaves 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue and sits in a county.

College GameDay is on campus. An ESPN spokesperson told USA TODAY the President would not sit as guest picker. That is their show. It is not this clock.

A game is not a midterm

A Homepage Tile Is Not a Ballot already locked the test: a current event on this register is not a precinct. Attendance at an SEC opener does not enroll Knox County. It does not score Texas or Tennessee as districts. The door in this paper is the county the stadium sits in — Knox County, Tennessee, FIPS 47093 — because that is where the public hour is happening.

A departure gaggle on the South Lawn is a different minute. Pool questions on the way to Andrews are a different minute. This paper does not move those gaggles into the title. Noon at Neyland is the line.

What this paper will not do

It will not pick a team. It will not treat orange or burnt orange as a party. It will not call a jumbotron shot a speech from the East Room. It will not sell Legal Publication of a kickoff.

Closing

Saturday, September 26, 2026, 12:00 p.m. Eastern, Neyland Stadium, Knoxville. That is the hour the house printed. Watch the game if you came for football. Do not ask this paper to turn the bowl into a ballot.

A travel-pool kickoff is a public hour in a named stadium. It is not a rally. Date the bowl. Leave the midterm on November 3.
